- 5. What were the purpose of government films?
- 6. What role did cities like Detroit, MI. have in wartime production? What was the nickname of the city during the war?
- 7. How do women gain opportunities during the war home front? How many women eventually made their way into new occupations?
- 8. Explain "the war effort"? Provide THREE (3) examples of how all American's were doing something for the war effort?
- 9. How did newsreels and propaganda films help with the war effort on the home front?
